



# **Children With Health Needs Who Cannot Attend School Policy**

## 1. Aims

This policy aims to ensure that:

Suitable education is arranged for pupils on roll who cannot attend school due to health needs

Pupils, staff and parents understand what the school is responsible for when this education is being provided by the local authority

## 2. Legislation and guidance

This policy reflects the requirements of the Education Act 1996.

It is also based on guidance provided by our local authority.

This policy complies with our funding agreement and articles of association.

## 3. Responsibilities of the school

### 3.1 If the school makes arrangements

Initially, the school will attempt to make arrangements to deliver suitable education for children with health needs who cannot attend school.

Parents and pupils will be consulted on what arrangements will be put in place through a meeting with SENDCo and class teacher.

The class teacher will be responsible for providing suitable remote education if appropriate and this will be monitored by the SENDCo. Parents will be able to contact the class teacher through Class Dojo, email or phone.

Once a pupil is able to return to school they may be supported through the use of reduced timetable and any other adjustments that may be needed to support their reintegration into school.

### 3.2 If the local authority makes arrangements

If the school can't make suitable arrangements, or the absence is for a significant amount of time Norfolk local Authority will become responsible for arranging suitable education for these pupils through the Medical Needs Team.

In cases where the local authority makes arrangements, the school will:

Work constructively with the local authority, providers, relevant agencies and parents to ensure the best outcomes for the pupil

Share information with the local authority and relevant health services as required

Help make sure that the provision offered to the pupil is as effective as possible and that the child can be reintegrated back into school successfully

When reintegration is anticipated, work with the local authority to:

- Plan for consistent provision during and after the period of education outside the school, allowing the pupil to access the same curriculum and materials that they would have used in school as far as possible

- Enable the pupil to stay in touch with school life (e.g. through newsletters, emails, invitations to school events or internet links to lessons from their school)
- Create individually tailored reintegration plans for each child returning to school
- Consider whether any reasonable adjustments need to be made

#### 4. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed annually.

At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
