- 4) At the moment finances do not allow for this to fully go ahead.

- 3) GetSet4PE subscription renewed yearly in order for teacher to access lesson plans.
- 1) If possible, book orienteering for next year again.

- Some outdoor adventurous activities are provided internally only, due to finance. Year groups provide a cross curricular outdoor day as part of their Topic (e.g. Autumn day in Year 1)
